Acanthosis Nigricans with Atypical Localization

Acanthosis nigricans has a predilection for intertriginous areas such as the neck, groin and axillae. We report a case where the lesions occurred on the sulcus alaris nasi and sulcus mentolabialis and which was diagnosed as benign acanthosis nigricans.

CASE REPORT

A 14-year-old boy presented to the outpatient polyclinic of dermatology with a 6-month history of hyperpigmentation and thickness on the chin and at the side of the nose. There was no family history. No relevant medication had been taken during the past 6 months.




Fig. 1. Lesions on the (a) sulcus alaris nasi; (b) sulcus mentolabialis.

There were no abnormal findings on physical examination. He weighed 55 kg and measured 160 cm in height. His chronological and skeletal ages were within normal limits. Dermatological examination revealed brownish—black hyperpigmented patches covered with papillomatous elevations on his sulcus alaris nasi and sulcus mentolabialis (Fig. 1).

Routine hematologic and urine analyses, including full blood count, serum chemistry, plasma glucose and plasma protein electrophoresis, were within normal limits. Thyroid function tests were also within normal limits. Fasting insulin level was 18.3 μ U/l/ml (normal range 5 – 20 μ U/l/ml). Hb Λ_{1c} testing was not performed.

The clinical diagnosis of acanthosis nigricans was confirmed by histopathologic examination of a skin biopsy which showed hyperkeratosis, papillomatosis, acanthosis and lymphoid cell infiltration into the superficial dermis.

The sites most commonly involved in acanthosis nigricans are the axillae, the back and sides of the neck, the anogenital region and the groin although the other flexures, the submammary region, the umbilicus and, in some cases, almost all of the skin may be affected (1). The unusual localization in this case may be because the face can be a flexural area.
