Dr Sonkoly is Senior Lecturer of Dermatology and Venereology at Karolinska Institutet, Stockholm. She received her basic training in medicine at the Semmelweis University in Budapest and the University of Szeged, where she was awarded her PhD in Immunology in 2005. After

initial postdoctoral training at the Department of Dermatology, Heinrich-Heine University, Dusseldorf, she moved to Sweden in 2006 and has since been affiliated with Karolinska Institutet and Karolinska University Hospital, and since 2016 has been a specialist in Dermatology and Venereology. Her special research interest is in the pathogenesis of psoriasis and related diseases, focusing on the role of microRNAs. She is the author of nearly 50 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters.



Dr Ågren is Adjunct Professor of Surgery with special focus on Tissue Repair and Regeneration at the Department of Clinical Medicine, University of Copenhagen. He is also affiliated with Copenhagen Wound Healing Center, Bispebjerg Hospital, Copenhagen, Denmark. Dr Ågren was awarded his PhD in Experimen-

tal Pathology in 1990 at Linköping University, Sweden. He subsequently completed a postdoctoral fellowship at the Department of Dermatology and Cutaneous Surgery, University of Miami School of Medicine, Miami, Florida, USA in 1993. He then moved to Copenhagen, where he was a Senior Scientist and manager for 5 years in industry. Since then he has held various different academic positions. Dr Ågren's special research interest include the role of extracellular matrix and matrix metalloproteinases in wound healing in different tissues. He has published over 120 articles and has edited 2 book volumes on wound healing.



As for myself, I will resign as Editor-in-Chief of *ActaDV* at the end of this year, a position I have held since 1999. I am happy to announce that my replacement, **Professor Artur Schmidtchen**, Lund University, will be taking on the role of Editor-in-Chief in January 2018. Dr Schmidtchen, who

is currently the Co-Editor, is a distinguished researcher and clinician, who has numerous publications in highranking journals, mainly in the fields of tissue repair, innate immunology and bacteriology. I wish him the best of success in his new position as Editor-in-Chief.
