The main conclusion of these meetings was that we will put more emphasis on the following in future:

Education: Forum should contain more material on education, e.g. educational reviews, examples of examination questions, multiple choice questions, etc. We will try to build up stronger relationships with the National Societies in the Nordic countries in order to make Forum more closely connected with the dermatology training in each country.

Guidelines: We will publish guidelines on different treatment methods. Also, we will open up for discussions about the various ways the same disease may be treated in different countries.

Discussion forum: We will try to create more dynamic and interactive internet-based discussion forums and include the possibility of registering and recognizing individual dermatologic learning activities (CMI credits) for these activities.

The reason for choosing Uppsala for the latter meeting was that *Acta Dermato*-




Fig. 3. We also had the opportunity to meet Carl von Linné in person. Despite his age (born 1707) he looked rather healthy. Hans Odöö acting as Linné. Insert: Linné himself.

Some of the members of the Advisory Board of *Acta Dermato-Venereologica* were invited to this symposium as speakers; a short extract of their lectures is given on p. 139.


