## Travel broadens the mind

This issue of Forum sets out the second set of guidelines from the Division of Venereology in Sweden. These guidelines, on *Mycoplasma genitalium* infection, presented by Carin Anagrius at the sexually transmitted diseases clinic in Falun, Sweden, will be of value to all dermato-venereologists. As you may have noticed, in past issues of Forum, some of our colleagues have reported on their trips abroad, working at or visiting dermatology departments. This issue contains two such reports. The first is by Elke Weisshaar, Professor in Dermatology at the University of Heidelberg, Germany (page 39). In her two and a half week visit to Mbarara in Uganda she learnt about Ugandan dermatology and experienced the friendliness and gratitude of the patients at the Dermatological University Hospital Mbarara.

Sirkku Peltonen, Turku, Finland, is the author of the second report (page 44). Together with three of her colleagues, she visited two dermatology clinics in London, UK. The group wanted to deepen their knowledge and practical experience, especially with respect to epidermolysis bullosa. It required a great deal of paperwork to arrange the visit.

He concludes that the best treatment for juvenile PRP is a positive attitude and a good emollient and not the aggressive medication that they tried initially.

Johanna Mandelin, University of Helsinki, Finland, writes about tacrolimus ointment for long-term treatment on page 49, and Lena Hagströmer, Karolinska University Hospital, Sweden, focuses on defence defects on page 50.
