### Introduction

In the following interview we will ask questions about the world around you – the environmental factors that may have a negative and/or positive impact on your life. For example, if you think about the accessibility of public places, you might experience accessibility problems that make it harder or impossible to visit certain public places. Or maybe all public places you might want to visit are accessible, thereby making your life easier. It is possible to rate an environmental factor both as a barrier and as a facilitator, for instance, if some public places are accessible and others not, or you may not have issues with accessibility for your leisure activities, but you may have troubles to get to your workplace. If accessibility keeps you from visiting some public places, you may choose to avoid participating in certain activities because of these accessibility problems, or you might overcome these problems, e.g. by asking people for help.

We will 1.) ask questions about environmental factors which influence your *social and* community life such as to visit friends or receive visits from friends, to go out, to go shopping, to go to church, to participate in sports or outdoor activities, etc. and 2.) ask questions about environmental factors which influence your *productive life* such as work, school, volunteering, taking care of children or doing housework.
