BOOK REVIEWS

Skin Cancer and UV Radiation edited by P. Altmeyer, K. Hoffmann and M. Stücker, 1997, 1330 pages, 480 Figures. ISBN 3-540-62723-5. Hardcover. Price US\$ 225. Springer Verlag, Berlin.

The International Congress on Skin Cancer and UV Radiation was held in Bochum, Germany, October 1996 and the proceedings have been published in a most useful book covering various aspects of the subject. Molecular basics, immunology, melanins, pigmentation and erythema of irradiated human skin as well as UV protections and therapeutic use of UV radiation are covered on the first 500 pages. Then comes articles on epidemiology, risk factors and molecular basics of skin cancer. Prevention, diagnosis and therapy of skin cancer are covered in the final chapters. The clinical and histological parts are illustrated with good colour photographs. The 254 contributions have references up to 1996.

The book gives a very useful and comprehensive view of an important field by experts from a wide range of specialities. It is recommended for all medical libraries and everyone with a basic interest in this subject.

Dermatology: An Illustrated Colour Text, second editions by David J. Gawkrodger. 130 pages. 300 colour figures. 1997. ISBN 0-443-05328-6. Paperback. Churchill Livingstone, New York.

When the first issue of this textbook was published in 1992 it was a pleasant surprise for many medical students; suddenly a fairly cheap paperback version of a textbook with a very didactic and a good, concise text was available. Now a second edition of this book, also containing a chapter on genitourinary medicine, has appeared. The format is essentially the same as before, but several illustrations have been improved, and new chapters on molecular genetics and HIV disease have been added. Although the text is usually up-to-date there are a few examples of the opposite: retinoids (tretinoin, isotretinoin, adapalene, tazarotene) are not included in the Table on topical drugs in dermatology, and valacyclovir is not mentioned as the drug of choice for treating herpes virus infections. Also the chapters on skin biology and biochemistry need some updating, e.g. with respect to the formation of cytoskeletal keratins. The fixed format (one double-page for each chapter), although visually attractive, sometimes creates a constraint. For example, old knowledge about fungicidal therapy and compression bandage for leg ulcers, instead of being integrated into preexisting chapters, appear separately under "New trends in dermatological therapy'

By and large, however, the textbook is easy and interesting to read and should be a good alternative to the more comprehensive textbooks in dermatology.
