Skin diseases after organ transplantation by S. Euvrard, J. Kanitakis and A. Claudy, 1998. 228 pages. ISBN 2-7420-0240-5. Paperback. Price FF320.-; US\$58. John Libbey Eurotext.

Skin symptoms and signs due to long-term immunosuppressive therapy are an increasing problem world-wide. The most common reason for such immunosuppression is probably organ transplantation. There are now many patients who have been continuously immunosuppressed for more than 30 years following the beginning of kidney transplantation in the 60s. Sooner or later most of these patients will develop skin complication, such as chronic viral infections and UV-induced cancer. It is therefore important that both dermatologists and other physicians prescribing immunosuppressive drugs are aware of the latest development in this field. The book edited by a Lyon group of specialists (Euvrard, Kanitakis and Claudy) fills a gap in the literature. The editors have recruited almost 40 authors mainly from France, who together cover a wide range of expertise, extending from the present situation in organ transplantation and immunology to recent advances in the diagnostics and treatment of skin problems associated with immunosuppression and graft-versus host reactions. In most of the 27 chapters the reference lists appear up-to-date and the text is well written. However, some of the introductory chapters about immunology and viral infections would have benefited from more illustrations and tables summarizing the rather complex issues that are discussed. Plenty coloured clinical illustrations appear at the end of the book. By and large, the book by Euvrard, Kanitakis and Claudy is very useful and well worth its price. Since it is a paperback type of edition it can easily go into the pocket and be carried during the ward rounds.
